I HEREBY GIVE YOU NOTICE, that it is my intention to erect certain Buildings in this District, and that the following particulars relate thereto, namely:—

6	Distance across such open space	214 yards.
7	Description of Ventilation	Casement Windows fitted to open top and bottom.
8	Width of Street or open space opposite Buildings	Road opposite site 31 ft. wide.
9	Size and Description of Drains	Glazed Drain pipes in casement.
10	Inclination of Drains	3 ft. per yard.
11	Description of Outlet of Drains	Sink & closet to cesspool rain water to ditch.

AND I herewith leave at the Offices of your Surveyor detailed Plans and Sections of every floor of such intended new Buildings, drawn to a scale of not less than one inch to every eight feet, showing the position, form, and dimensions of the several parts of such Buildings, and of the Water Closet, Privy, Cesspool, Ashpit, Well, and all other Appurtenances; and also a Block Plan drawn to a scale of not less than one inch to every 44 feet, showing the position of the Buildings and Appurtenances of the properties immediately adjoining the width and level of the Street, the level of the lowest floor of the intended Building, and of the Yard or Ground belonging thereto; also tracings of the above-mentioned Plans to be retained by the Council.





Their attention is particularly directed to BYE-LAWS 97 to 105, as to the giving of Notices.


PROPOSED — LODGE — TO — BERRY — HALL — SOLIHULL — FOR — J — H — GILLOTT — ESQ.




— ELEVATION — TO — DRIVE —




— ELEVATION — TO — ROAD —




— SIDE — ELEVATION —




— BACK — ELEVATION —




— GROUND — PLAN —
